



#### **Project Overview**

- Located at Grindle Road, Spring Creek, ~12 km north-east of Gatton and ~100 km south west of Brisbane
- The site has been master planned for the provision of two (2) separate correctional centres
- Only Stage 1 completed to date a 300 bed women's correctional centre which opened in 2012
- Stage 2 (this project) a new 1,000 bed, highsecurity facility for male prisoners only
- All necessary external site infrastructure to support
   Stage 2 was designed and constructed in Stage 1:
  - Roads and carparking (both staff & visitor)
  - External site services (power, potable water, storm water and recycled water)
  - Various external buildings
  - Initial bulk earthworks for the Stage 2 building platform

#### The Southern Queensland Correctional Precinct Stage 2 (SQCPS2) expansion will:

Address overcrowding across the correctional system in Queensland



Adopt a 'health and rehabilitation' operating model which will support safer communities through enhanced mental health and drug and alcohol rehabilitation services



Deliver an economic boost to the region and additional jobs during construction and operation





Improve safety of correctional officers and prisoners

Supporting over 900 jobs during peak periods with over 500 permanent jobs once the centre has opened.



#### Queensland Government Building and Construction Training Policy

#### **Policy statement**

The Queensland Government Building and Construction Training Policy (Training Policy) supports employment opportunities and skills development in Queensland's building and construction industry. The Training Policy also focuses on increasing the economic independence of Aboriainal and Torres Strait Islander Queenslanders in the industry.

The Training Policy is one element in a long-standing partnership between the building and construction industry and the Queenesland Government to develop the industry's skills base and future workforce capability. It requires contractors to employ apprentices and trainees and undertake other workforce training as mandated components of being awarded work on eliable Queensland Government torolects.

#### Policy objective

The objective of the Training Policy is to capitalise on the potential of Queensland Government and government owned corporation (GOC) building and civil construction projects to:

- create additional employment and training opportunities for apprentices and trainees in the building and construction industry.
- · improve the skills base of the building and construction industry
- provide employment, training and business supply opportunities for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Queenslanders.

#### Scope

The Training Policy applies to eligible Queensland Government and GOC building and/or civil construction projects throughout Queensland. A core requirement is that a minimum of 10 per cent of the total labour hours on eligible projects is to be undertaken by apprentioes and/or trainees and through other workforce training. From 1 September 2017, this core requirement increases to 15 per cent for eligible major building and/or civil construction projects.

All Queensland Government departments and statutory bodies, as defined in the Financial Accountability Act 2009, are required to comply with the Training Policy. Additionally, from 1 July 2015 the Training Policy also applies to all GOCs tendering or undertaking building and/ or civil construction projects with a contract sum above \$20 million (including GST).








#### **Best Foot Forward**

- Attend tender writing and upskilling workshops
- Seek industry advice and support
- Submit all paperwork by the required timeframe
- Provide phone and email contact details
- Answer all questions to the best of your knowledge
- Don't leave any questions blank
- Attach requested documents to support your submission
- Don't assume, ask for clarification
- Check your submission, and then check again
- If unsuccessful, take the opportunity to ask why
- Paint the best picture of your business at every stage.




#### **Project Details**



#### Location and Site

The Southern Queensland Correctional Precinct is located at Grindle Road. Spring Creek, about 12 km north-east of Gatton and about 100 km south west of Brisbane in the Lockyer Valley.

- The site has been master planned for the ultimate provision of 4 separate correction centres with a total site capacity of approximately 3500 beds.
- . Only Stage 1 of the precinct has thus far been completed with the construction of a 300 bed women's correctional centre called the Southern Queensland Correctional Centre (SQCC) which opened in 2012.
- . All necessary external site infrastructure to support the future provision of a 1000 bed men's centre was designed and constructed as part of Stage 1 inclusive of: roads and carparking (both staff & visitor); external site services infrastructure inclusive of power, potable water, waste water, storm water and recycled water, Various external buildings including Visitor Processing, Staff Amenities, Staff Training, Dog Squad and Central (Energy) Services; and Bulk earthworks for the building platform for the future 1000 bed men's centre.




