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1. INTRODUCTION

BAE Systems Maritime Australia are seeking Expressions of Interest (EOI) to supply **Fibre Reinforced or Composite panels as a non-ship requirement** for the Hunter Class Frigate Program (HCFP).

The Hunter Class Frigates will be built at the BAE Systems Maritime Australia facility in Osborne, South Australia. BAE Systems Maritime Australia are committed to maximising opportunities for Australia industry through the Hunter program, which is the largest surface ship project in the nation's defence history.

The information provide within your EOI will be used to down select contractors to receive a formal Request for Tender (RFT).

2. SCOPE

As part of the modernisation plans for the Osborne Naval Shipyard, the design of the Unit Fabrication Hall incorporates a mobile production line to assemble hull structure elements into ship units. This fabrication line utilises movable construction jigs referred to as jig wagons.

The jig wagon has been specifically designed by BAE Systems Maritime Australia to suit the design and build strategy for the Hunter Class Frigate (HCF) Program. One of the key elements of the jig wagon is the infill panels to the perimeter of the units to allow for suitable access for personnel as required.

Due to the design of the jig wagon structure, there are three different infill panel types required. The length and width of the panels are the same, however the notches around the jig wagon pin bracket varies for each of the infill panel types..

3. MATERIALS

The infill panels are to be constructed from Fibre Reinforced Plastic (or Composite Plastic) to the dimensions detailed in the drawing. The panels are required to withstand the floor loading requirements as detailed in Section 4.2 of AS1657-2018.

It is preferable that the Materials supplied should be compliant to the Material Specifications, Design and Grade as identified by the applicable Technical documentation which will be issued to down selected suppliers during the formal RFT phase. Alternatively, to enable our Hunter Class Frigate Program to incorporate maximum Australian Industry Content, alternate & substitute parts and materials will be considered.

- 6. Do you have the ability to manufacture to withstand floor-loading requirements as detailed in Section 4.2 of AS1657-2018?
- 7. Have you had previous experience providing Contract Data Requirements List (CDRL) and Objective Quality Evidence (OQE) documentation to a Defence Program? Please provide examples of experience.
